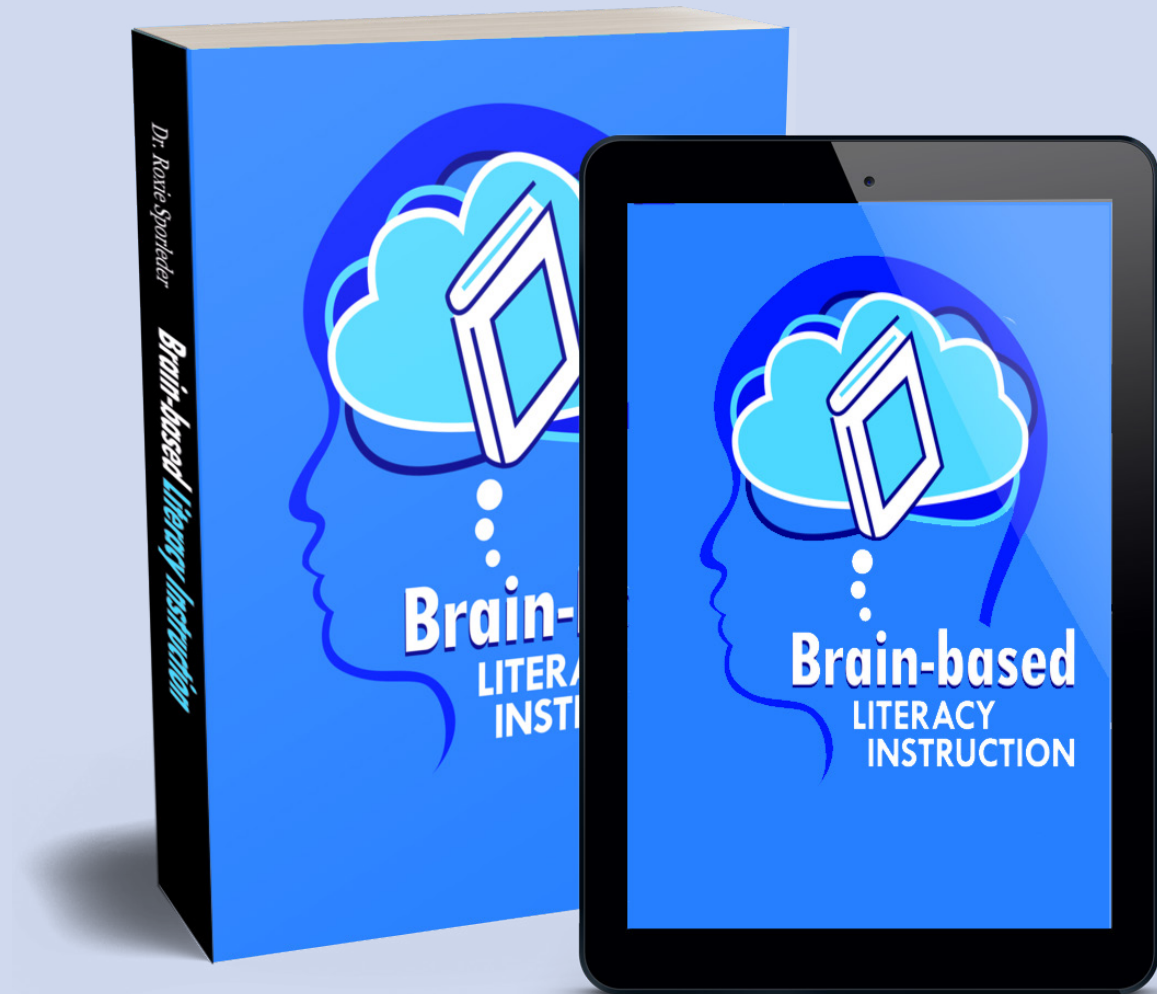

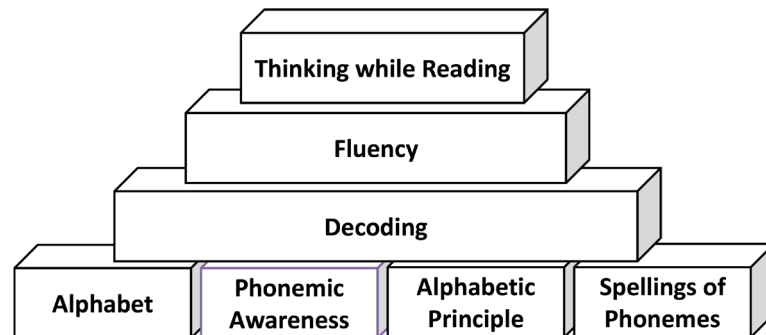

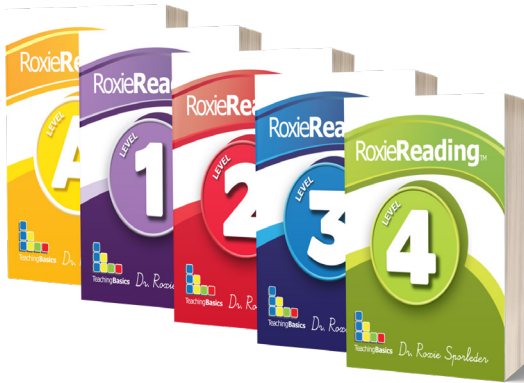

RoxieReading: Our Curriculum



Five Ability Levels

This multisensory curriculum is designed to meet the needs of all learners, including those with dyslexia.

It can be used in the classroom as well as in intervention groups to teach dyslexic and other poor readers.

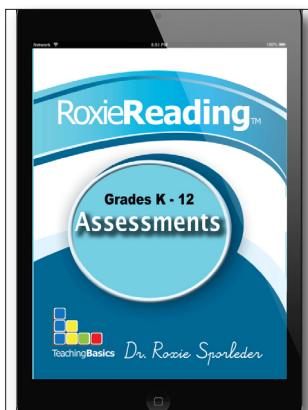
The unique kinesthetic activities trigger students to process words through the language centers of the left brain — just what good readers do.

Students engage in 8 or 9 activities during a lesson of 35 to 60 minutes.

RoxieReading curriculum is based on **ability level** and **not** on **grade level**.

RoxieReading: Screening



Dyslexia and other reading problems are often not detected.

- > Students in K - 3, especially those coming from other schools, may be reading at grade level because they have memorized the words. These students have processed words as a poor reader and will crash at 4th, 5th, or 6th grade. They will struggle.
- > Students in K - 12 may do poorly in school or struggle to finish homework but the reading issue is not recognized.

Reading is a gateway skill.

All students need to be screened for reading deficiencies.

RoxieReading provides training on how to use and score a simple developmental spelling test that will identify dyslexia and other reading problems. The curriculum can then address those deficiencies quickly. For students in Grades 2 - 12, these deficiencies can be addressed with only 30 to 50 hours of instruction. Most of these students will show improvement after 10 lessons.
